Basic Climbing - Using the 4-H Center's 25' outdoor climbing wall, campers will learn the basics of climbing safety, equipment, bouldering, climbing, and belaying.

Advanced Climbing - Only available to older campers (12+) who have previously taken Basic Climbing: this class covers more advanced climbing techniques and skills.

Canoeing - Campers will learn about paddling and water safety, the parts of the canoe / paddle, canoe types, and paddling strokes.

Calling All Wildlife - Learning to call wildlife is fun if you know what to say. Go home with your very own call Learn how to blow bubbles through wood and take a hike.

Bugged Out!- Come meet and get up close and personal with all sorts of bugs, learn what makes them tick.

Challenge Course - Campers will learn to work together in small groups to overcome various types of initiatives and challenges, using teamwork.

CSI - Crime Scene Investigation, learn some of the tools police detectives use to solve crimes.

Zumba - Taught by a licensed Zumba Instructor.

Fishing - Campers will learn the basics of freshwater lake fishing and may catch a variety of species.

Golf - Learn golfing techniques. Equipment is provided.

Kayaking - Using individual kayaks, campers will learn about paddling and water safety, the parts of the kayak, paddle, kayak types, and paddling strokes.

Basketball- Campers will learn the fundamentals of basketball; improve their shooting, ball handling and footwork skills - all while having a blast shooting hoops!

Outdoor Cooking- Learn how to cook in the great outdoors! Outdoor Adventure- Campers will learn the basics of outdoor adventures including hiking, backpacking, camping, orienteering, knot-tying, and campsite set-up and will conduct an overnight camp-out at the 4-H Center's Far Point.

Riflery- Campers will be introduced to shooting sports and will learn about firearms safety and basic marksmanship.

Small Animal Science - Campers will learn how to manage and maintain a small-animal barn and how to care for animals such as calves, goats, sheep, rabbits, dogs, and hamsters.

Swimming, Beginning -Campers will learn how to become more comfortable with the water, including how to submerge their head, water safety, the basics of flotation, and simple
